Mirumiru Bubbletent

WHERE Tenterfield, NSW

With a name as cute as bubble tent, it won't be hard to get the kids to go on this family getaway to the rolling New England region. Mirumiru Bubbletent sits on a family-owned farm in the NSW town of Tenterfield. Stay in the new Mary Ann Bugg Tiny Bubble Tent suspended among gum trees - a perfect hideaway for three (small) kids, with a transparent roof so they can gaze at the star-studded sky. Parents can sleep in the neighbouring Captain Thunderbolt, where there are earth-toned interiors and natural linens. Spend days swimming in the dam, bushwalking and cooking marshmallows over a campfire. Woodgate Beach Holiday Park

WHERE Woodgate, QLD

With more than 16 kilometres of coastline, Woodgate, south of Bundaberg, is rated one of Australia's best beaches. Stay at the beachfront NRMA Woodgate Beach Holiday Park, bordered by the ocean playground and Burrum Coast National Park, which is home to 26,000 hectares of wetlands, walking tracks and an abundance of wildlife. New family safari tents (so luxe they can hardly be called tents) are built from rich woods with a cuby-like sleeping nook the kids will love. Wilpena Pound Resort

WHERE Ikara-Flinders Ranges, SA
The Adnyamathanha people have lived in
the Ikara-Flinders Ranges for tens of
thousands of years, and Wilpena Pound, or
Ikara, is a sacred place. Bed down in one of
four new stargazing safari tents, part of a
multi-million-dollar renovation that includes

Nestled among spotted gums and paperbark trees (hence the name), Paperbark Camp was Australia's first glamping retreat. Stay in one of five new Deluxe Plus tents, created for families of four, with polished hardwood flooring, bathtubs with bush views and indulgent day beds.
